

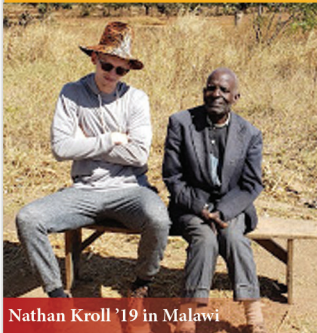

MAGELLAN PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Magellan Project provides funding for W&J students to pursue independent summer research projects or internships that extend liberal arts learning outside of the curriculum. These opportunities are open to freshmen, sophomores, and juniors. Students can complete more than one Magellan Project during their time at W&J. These projects typically range from 3 to 12 weeks in length and can be domestic or international. Magellan Projects are meant to be truly independent learning and personal growth experiences.

ELIGIBILITY

- GPA of at least 2.5
- Must be a freshman, sophomore, or junior
- Good standing (financial and conduct) with the College
